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SNOMED CT

Update



The SNOMED CT in Primary Care implementation project is excited to share the following progress:

EMIS started their SNOMED CT live pilots on 9 May at five GP practices across England and are part-way through their planned pilot phase. This is progressing well and deployment is scheduled for early July with completion in August.

Staff at the national pilot practices have reported positively:

- "The coding is slightly different but that's it I typed in 'slapped cheek' and 'Erythema infectiosum' [the preferred clinical term for slapped cheek in SNOMED CT] came up. This is the only thing I've noticed, everything else is the same. I've done blood pressure, sats, everything" GP
- "So far, so good, I've not noticed a big change, it's all run really smoothly. I was worried about the system crashing during my clinic, but nothing like that happened." practice nurse
- "It looks a bit different, but from an admin point of view it was easy to use. It was simpler than we expected it to be. No one is shouting and no doctors have screamed! I've coded all day and it's not slowed me down. We were really nervous about this, but the sky hasn't fallen in and it's been good." practice manager

• "I memorised a lot of the Read codes, so I was worried about how I would be impacted by the change with the scanning I do every day. But I found the code browser really easy to use and was able to find everything that I needed." - receptionist

The SNOMED CT in Primary Care project team strongly recommends that users review the <u>EMIS guide</u> and undertake the recommended house-keeping tasks to prepare for migration to SNOMED CT as soon as possible.

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Electronic referral service (eRS)



Referring clotting/anticoagulation patients to OUH via eRS

A reminder that clotting/anticoagulation patients need to be referred to one of the following clinics and **NOT** Clinical Haematology:

- Anticoagulation-Haemophilia-Oxford University Hospitals-RTH 7940601 –
 people on anticoagulation therapy
- Haemostasis & Thrombosis -Oxford University Hospitals RTH 134332 bleeding/clotting disorders

Oxford University Hospitals will publish new Referral Assessment Service on e-RS for **clinical haematology.** These will be split between the Churchill and Horton General Hospitals. Please note:with effect from **1 July 2019**, a number of OUH services which are currently directly bookable in e-Referral will be merged into two Referral Assessment Services.

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GP referral pro formas



Mini survey and referrer education - Unlocking Referral Forms, and the GDPR

OCCG has been made aware of several cases of patients who have complained to their GP surgery because they were unhappy that information about them, which they considered irrelevant to the referral, was included in the 'Problem' list in an EMIS outbound referral.

According to the best information available to us, we believe that 80% of referrers know that our forms can be unlocked, and most people know how – it is only 3 clicks. We want to improve awareness of how to unlock forms, and gather your feedback on what policy you would like us to use when programming the pro formas, to strike the most practical balance between automated merging, and time-consuming but safer manual merging of Problem lists.

Please ask people from your practice who use forms to complete this <u>MINI SURVEY</u> and discuss in your practice meetings how to unlock forms.

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News and release notification July 2019 - Keeping system pro formas up to date



Zip folders containing full sets of referral pro formas can be found on the <u>Referral</u>

<u>Pro formas</u> page of the OCCG website.

The zip folder EMIS-Pro-formas, with a date stamp in the format YYYYMMDD, contains all of the EMIS referral pro formas currently in use. It can be saved, and imported in one step from within EMIS Web.

Also found on the Referral Pro formas page, the documents 'How to Cleanse your EMIS Pro forma library' and 'Working with GP Pro formas' give instructions on how to import the *single* zip folder and remove all old templates

which have been replaced.

GPs and other staff should be discouraged from using their own local copies of pro formas as they can miss out on important changes, which may put the patient at risk.

Release of Vision pro formas is not always concurrent with the EMIS forms as they require further processing. The zip folder INPS-Pro-formas, with a date stamp in the format YYYYMMDD, contains all of the InPS Vision pro formas currently in use. Some of these pro formas have been upgraded to include SmartTags, which reduces the need to enter data by hand. They can be identified by a suffix of 's'.
