Speaking of 'out with the old and in with the new', I would like to highlight some changes that have been planned which we hope will keep you informed and up to date on all things digital and make us more efficient in how we

achieve that.

Many of you working in Primary Care have voiced concerns about how difficult it is to stay on top of developments and that everything is further complicated by too many emails claiming to be *business critical*. We hope to improve matters by incorporating much of what is circulated via Wire in the GP Bulletin. The benefits of this approach are many: it will give you a one-stop source for information; it will reduce email traffic; while still in operation, the length of Wire will be reduced significantly; and it will enable us to be more responsive to the rapidly-changing world of Digital (as the GP Bulletin is published weekly and Wire monthly).

Invariably there will be a period of adjustment which we shall try to make as painless as possible. For now the plans are as follows:

- Wire is to be phased out by the end of March 2020
- As much content as possible will be incorporated in the GP Bulletin
- Meanwhile the format of Wire articles will start to change from full, bespoke articles to snippets which will include READ MORE... hyperlinks
- Content will be hosted on the OCCG website.

We will continue to work closely with the Primary Care team at OCCG to help manage this transition and address issues that may crop up.

On a personal note, it has been an absolute pleasure to create and distribute Wire to you over all these years; Wire nerds may note that it originally appeared, I think, in 2010 or was it 2011? Suffice it to say, Wire has been around for some time and this really is the end of an era.

Online consultations - are you ready? Countdown to 1 April deadline

All patients have the right to online consultations by 1 April 2020, and video consultations by April 2021.

36% of Oxfordshire patients now have access to online consultations at their practices. We know that many other practices are in discussion about a solution. Please be aware of the deadline and note that the implementation period can take some time (eg. eConsult is 30 days).

Following feedback, the national team has produced a much shorter, simpler toolkit for practices on implementing online consultations.

PC and Windows 10 replacement programme - update

The GPIT PC and Windows 10 replacement programme is moving forward and has now been deployed across 36 sites, with a number of practices already booked in over the next two months.

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Electronic Prescription Service (EPS)



Changes to EPS data sourcing

Previously, NHSD provided us with data each month; we are now sourcing our data from the NHS Business Services Authority (NHS BSA). NHS BSA reports on *actual* data (as opposed to *estimated* data) and does not make use of tools to support forecasting; the end result of this change is that the data will always be verified and accurate but it will be a few months behind what we have become used to**.

**Current data is from October 2019.

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EPS Phase 4 - update

NHS Digital has confirmed issues with the Phase 4 upgrade that are preventing the upgrade from integrating with EMIS practices; for this reason, any previously advertised implementation dates are currently inaccurate and revised timetables are being determined. Practices will be kept in the touch about timings as dates become available. In the meantime, please make sure staff who use EPS are

informed about the impact it will have on their day to day workings and working practices.

Repeat dispensing

A number of dispensing practices have queried the impact that Phase 4 will have on them. There is Information available on the NHS Digital website that would be of assistance.

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GP referral pro formas



News and release notification January 2020 Keeping system pro formas up to date

Zip folders containing full sets of referral pro formas can be found on the <u>Referral Pro formas</u> page of the OCCG website.

The zip folder EMIS-Pro-formas, with a date stamp in the format YYYYMMDD, contains all of the EMIS referral pro formas currently in use. It can be saved, and imported in one step from within EMIS Web.

Also found on the Referral Pro formas page, the documents 'How to Cleanse your EMIS Pro forma library' and 'Working with GP Pro formas' give instructions on how to import the *single* zip folder and remove all old templates which have been replaced.

GPs and other staff should be discouraged from using their own local copies of pro formas as they can miss out on important changes, which may put the patient at risk.

Release of Vision pro formas is not always concurrent with the EMIS forms as they require further processing. The zip folder INPS-Pro-formas, with a date stamp in the format YYYYMMDD, contains all of the InPS Vision pro formas currently in use. Some of these pro formas have been upgraded to include SmartTags, which reduces the need to enter data by hand. They can be identified by a suffix of 's'.
